

AN ACT to Amend provisions relating to hours and days of work in several enactments in order to facilitate the implementation of flexible working arrangements in Jamaica; and for connected matters.

[25th day of Nevember, 2014]

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Jamaica, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Employment (Flexible Work Short title. Arrangements) (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 2014.

- (c) in any shop in any circumstances specified in paragraph (1) other than circumstances in respect of which overtime rates are specified in subparagraphs (a) and (b), twice the hourly equivalent of the normal wages payable to the person so employed during the week in which he was so employed.".
